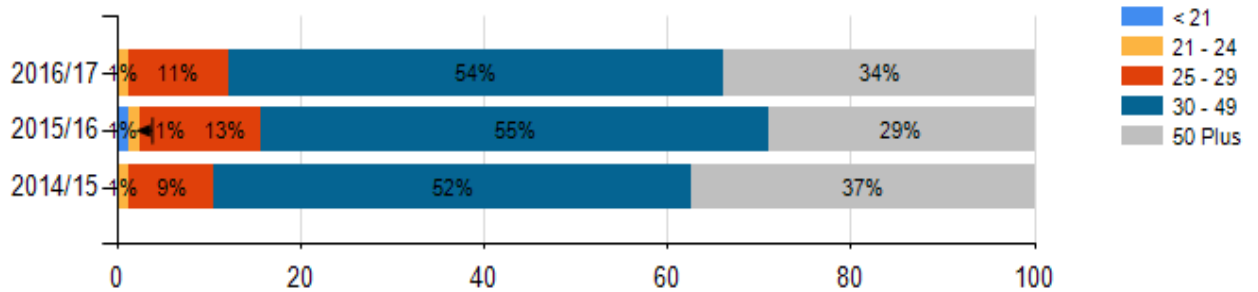

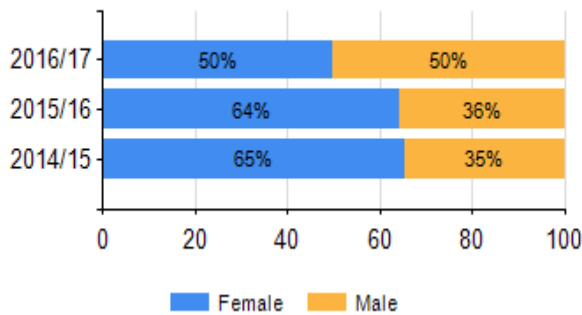

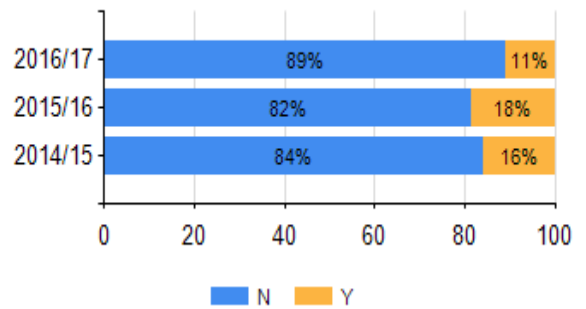

This course provides an opportunity for those who are unable to attend university to access classes by flexible learning.

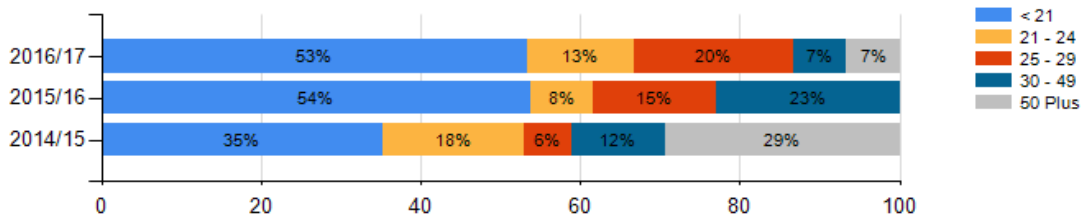
There is a wide age range but less of the younger students who would normally opt for campus-based learning.

While the course has traditionally attracted more female students, actions have been undertaken to attract more male students to all our courses and it is notable that there is no gender disparity in 2016-17.

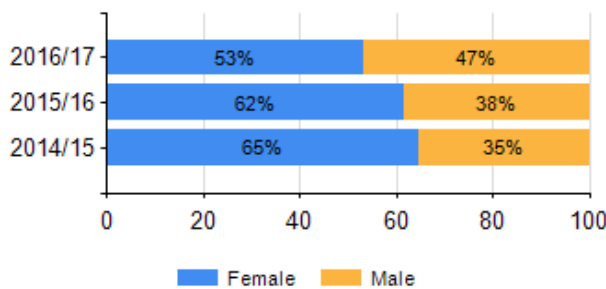
Disability stats. have remained between 10% and 20%

In terms of ethnicity, the above figures do not reflect the fact that the course continues to attract many international students.

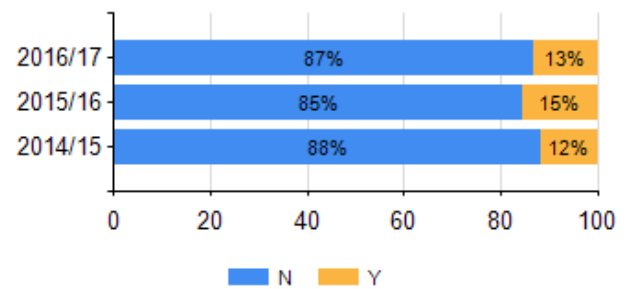
EDI001 - Age Categories

Despite being campus-based this course attracts an unusually diverse age-range of students.

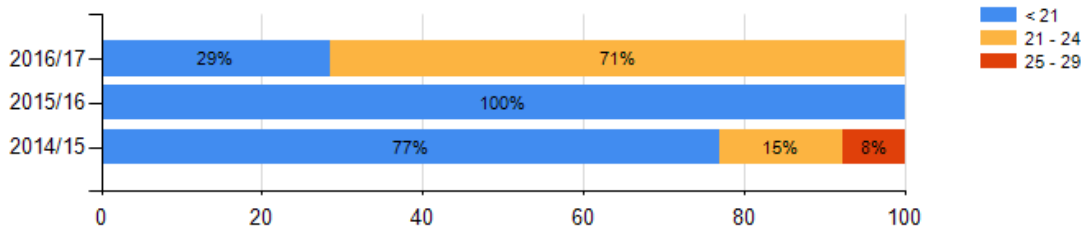
In common with most other courses, there are more female than male students however, the gender gap has fallen significantly in 2016/17.

The percentage of students declaring a disability is about the same as other courses and the ethnicity breakdown is as for most of our courses. These figures though do not show that this course regularly attracts international students.

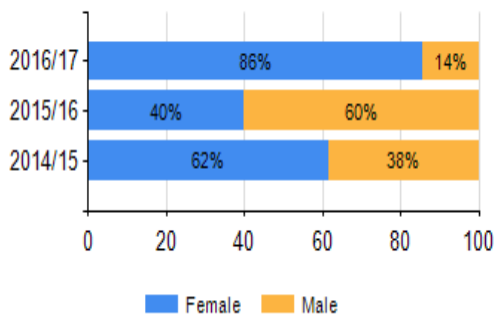

A full-time intensive course for fluent Gaelic speakers at SCQF 7.

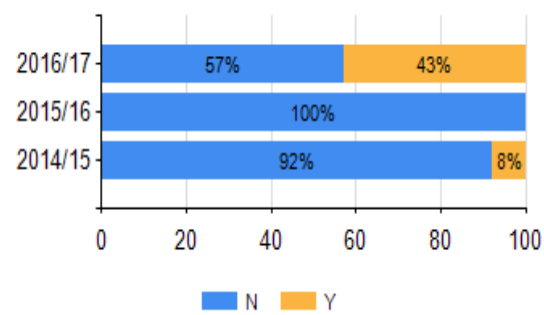
EDI001 - Age Categories

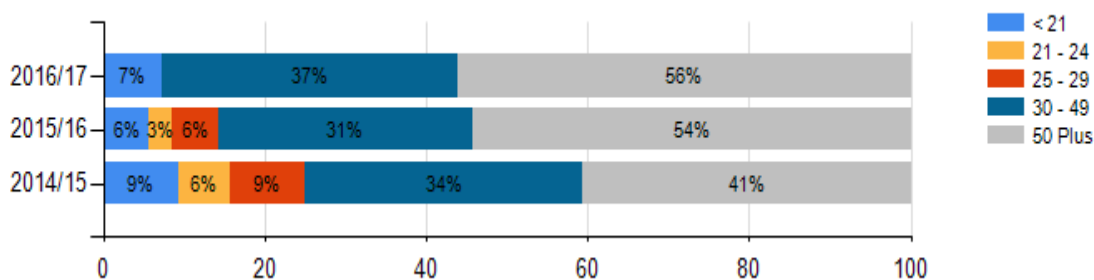
Comments

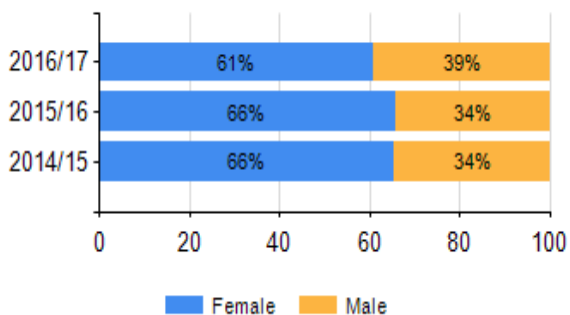

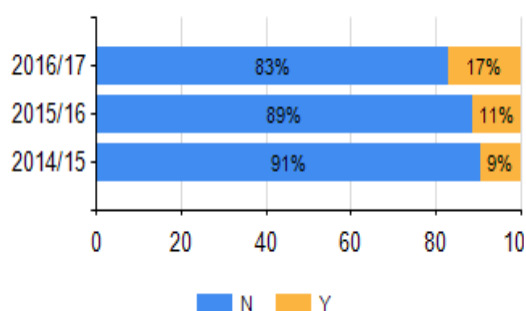
EDI001 - Age Categories

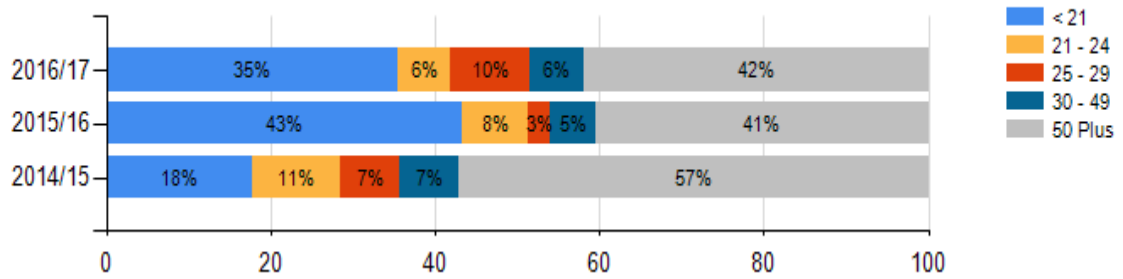

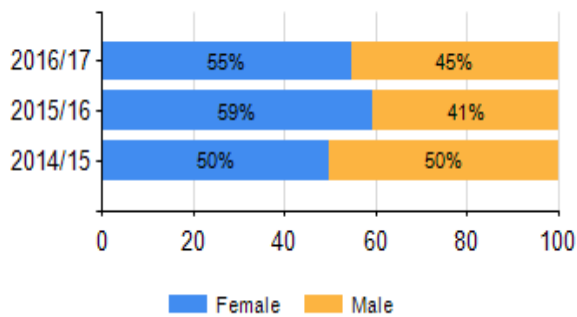

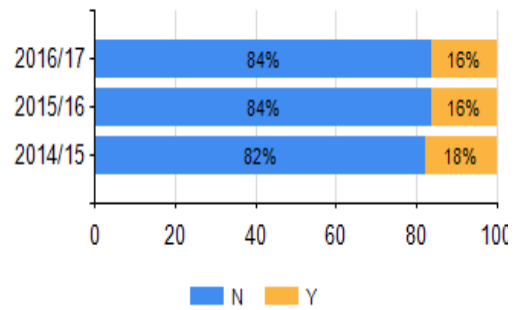
EDI001 - Age Categories

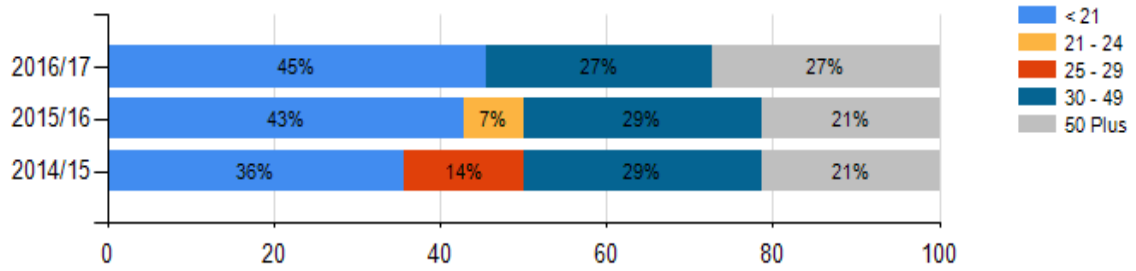

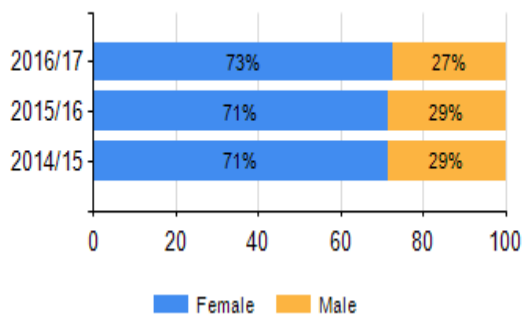

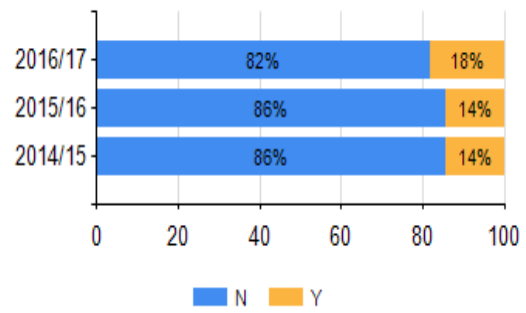
EDI001 - Age Categories

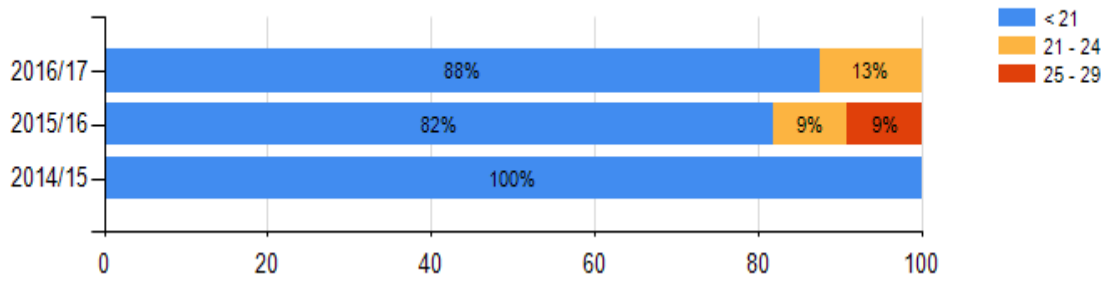

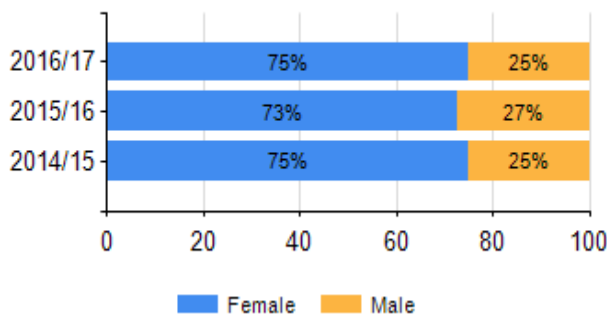

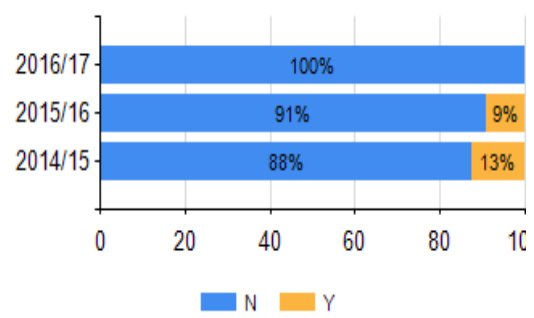
EDI001 - Age Categories

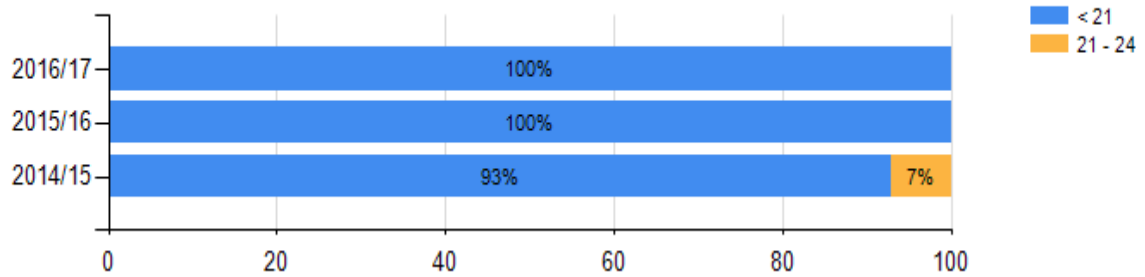

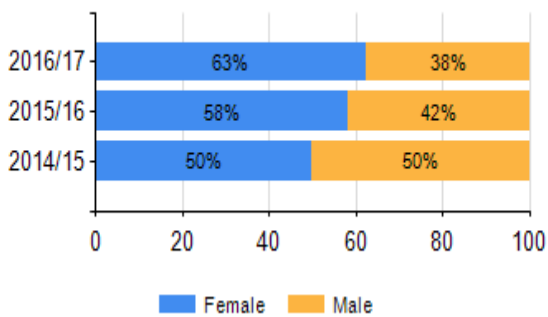
This course is campus-based and, in common with most campus-based courses, it attracts a younger demographic. The numbers of male students and those declaring a disability are fewer than most other courses.

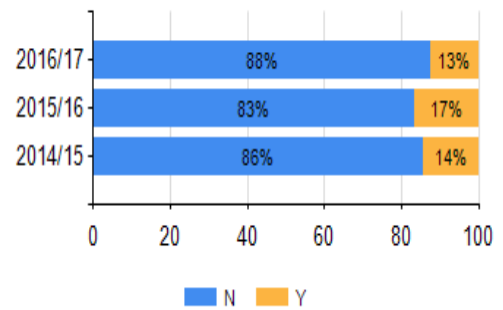
EDI001 - Age Categories

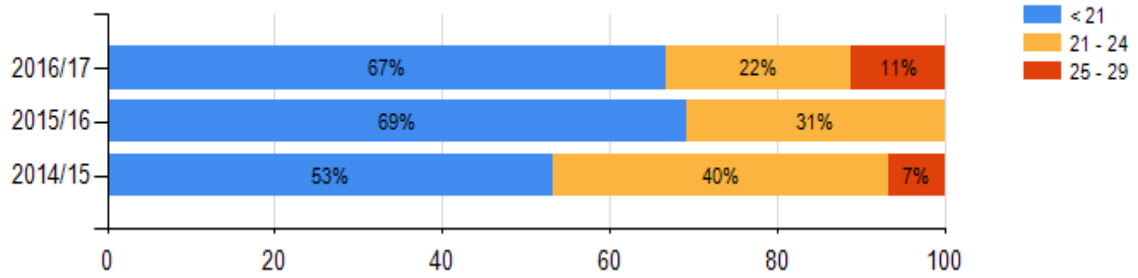

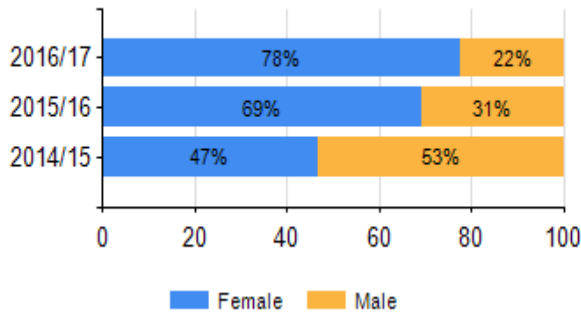

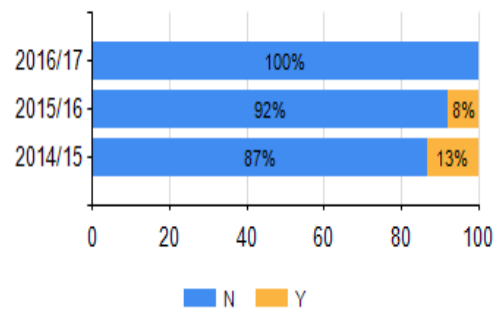
EDI001 - Age Categories
