Our legal reason to use the data is: Use is necessary for the purposes of legitimate interests pursued by Sabhal Mòr Ostaig.

The legitimate interest of the controller is: The ability to contact a nominated person for staff members in the event of an emergency.

The data we use includes special category (sensitive) data. We use this sensitive data under the following legal condition(s):

Purpose 2: Student support

As part of your student support journey, you may disclose sensitive personal data. This data will be used for the purposes of supporting and protecting as necessary. Such actions being required under the Post-16 Education Act, Equality Act, Children and Young peoples' Act, General duty of care, Mental Health (Scotland) Act.

Purpose 5: Returns and statistics

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig processes special category data by providing it to the Scottish Funding Council as required. The sharing happens on the basis that it is necessary for reasons of substantial public interest, on the basis of law under: Further and Higher Education (Scotland) Act 1992, Further and Higher Education (Scotland) Act 2005 and EU legislation for the provision of the European Social Fund.

Purpose 6: Academic standards & Purpose 11: Academic and conduct investigations

To ensure investigations are fair, Sabhal Mòr Ostaig needs to consider all relevant evidence. Sometimes it may be the case that the evidence may include, or be indicative, special category data. In such cases, Sabhal Mòr Ostaig will consider the lawfulness of processing this information based on the specific circumstances of the case.

Purpose 10: Equalities Monitoring and Reporting

Use is necessary for Sabhal Mòr Ostaig to comply with a legal obligation (social protection law) and undertake processing required by law (Equality Act 2010) which is in the public interest. That processing may include using the data to offer and provide support and assistance as



appropriate in line with the Equality Act. Use of the data is also necessary for a matter of substantial public interest, that being; identifying and keeping under review the existence or absence of equality of opportunity or treatment. All special sensitive data is stored in a secure location.

If you were to withhold the personal information we require for the enrolment process, the consequences would be:

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig would be unable to process your enrolment on your course. This would mean Sabhal Mòr Ostaig would be unable to deliver teaching or provide student services; your college account would be cancelled and any funding or bursary applications you may have made will be delayed or cancelled. Sabhal Mòr Ostaig would be unable to contact a nominated person for you in the event of an emergency.

Your data will, or may, be shared with the following recipients or categories of recipient:

The following rights are rights of data subjects:
